The Court orders that the motion to remand is GRANTED IN PART AND DENIED IN PART. The motion is GRANTED TO THE EXTENT that this case is REMANDED to the trial court to allow defendant to bring a motion for the relief he considers appropriate as to his claim that trial counsel was ineffective for failing to inform him of a plea offer and to develop an appropriate factual record as to that claim. In all other respects, the motion to remand is DENIED.

Defendant shall initiate the proceedings on remand within 14 days of the date of this order. The time for further proceedings in this appeal shall begin to run on the issuance of an order in the trial court that concludes the remand proceedings. However, if defendant fails to file a motion to initiate the proceedings within the time provided, the time for further proceedings in this appeal shall begin to run at the conclusion of that 14-day period. Defendant shall file with this Court a copy of any motion and supporting brief filed in the trial court, and defendant shall file a copy of any order entered within 14 days after entry.

The trial court shall hear and decide the matter within 56 days of the date of this order and shall make an appropriate determination on the record. Defendant shall order a transcript of any hearing on remand to be filed within 21 days after completion of the proceedings.
