MEMORANDUM.

Defendant pleaded guilty to knowingly retaining, possessing or secreting a financial transaction device without consent of the deviceholder, MCL 750.157n(1); MSA 28.354(14)(1), and was sentenced to eighteen to forty-eight months' imprisonment. He appeals as right. We affirm. This case has been decided without oral argument pursuant to MCR 7.214(A).

Defendant's sentence does not violate the principle of proportionality. *People v Milbourn*, 435 Mich 630; 461 NW2d 1 (1990).

Affirmed.
