MEMORANDUM.

Respondent-appellant appeals as of right from the juvenile court order terminating his parental rights to the minor children under MCL 712A.19b(3)(c)(i), and (j); (g) MSA 27.3178(598.19b)(3)(c)(i), (g) and (j). We affirm.

The juvenile court did not err in finding that the statutory grounds for termination were established by clear and convincing evidence. MCR 5.974(I); In re Miller, 433 Mich 331, 337; 445 NW2d 161 (1989); In re Hall-Smith, 222 Mich App 470; 564 NW2d 156 (1997). Moreover, respondent-appellant failed to put forth any evidence from which the juvenile court could conclude that termination was clearly not in the children's best interests. Hence, the court's decision to terminate
