MEMORANDUM.

In 1995, defendant pleaded guilty of attempted carrying of a concealed weapon, MCL 750.227; MSA 28.424, and was sentenced to three years' probation. A one-year jail sentence was later added as a condition of his probation because of a probation violation. Defendant subsequently pleaded guilty to again violating the terms of his probation by committing the subsequent offense of second-degree murder. On June 19, 1997, the trial court resentenced defendant in this case to twenty to thirty months' imprisonment, with credit for 643 days already served. Defendant appeals by right, arguing that his sentence is disproportionate and unsupported by any articulation of reasons by the sentencing judge. We dismiss defendant's appeal as moot because, as noted by plaintiff, defendant has already fully served his sentence in this case. *People v Rutherford*, 208 Mich App 198, 204; 526 NW2d 620 (1994), lv den 448 Mich 911 (1995).
